




Carbon monoxide is an invisible, odourless gas that can quickly kill you.

It's the law in Ontario to install carbon monoxide alarms in all homes with a fuel-burning appliance or an attached garage.

The Facts About Carbon Monoxide

Key Messages:

- 1. Carbon Monoxide (CO) is produced when fuels such as propane, gasoline, natural gas, heating oil or wood do not burn completely in fuel-burning appliances such as furnaces, hot water heaters, clothes dryers, stoves, fireplaces, portable fuel-burning heaters and generators, gas and charcoal barbeques, and vehicles.
- 2. Prevent CO build-up. Get an annual inspection of all fuel-burning appliances in your home and ensure chimneys and vents are not blocked. Visit COSafety.ca to find a registered fuel contractor near you.
- 3. If your home has a fuel-burning appliance or attached garage, install a carbon monoxide alarm adjacent to each sleeping area.
- 4. If your condo or apartment building has a service room, carbon monoxide alarms must be installed in the service room and adjacent to each sleeping area of all condo/apartment units above, below and beside the service room.
- 5. If your condo/apartment building has a garage, carbon monoxide alarms must be installed adjacent to each sleeping area of all condo/apartment units above, below and beside the garage.
- For added protection, install a carbon monoxide alarm on every storey of the home according to manufacturer's instructions.
- 7. Exposure to CO can cause flu-like symptoms without the fever. If your CO alarm sounds, and you or other occupants suffer from symptoms of CO poisoning, get everyone out of the home immediately. Then call 9-1-1 or your local emergency services number from outside the building.
- 8. If your CO alarm sounds, and no one is suffering from symptoms of CO poisoning, check to see if the battery needs replacing, or the alarm has reached its "end-of-life" before calling 9-1-1.
