Sleepover with Sparky

Background

50% of the fires Vaughan Fire and Rescue Service attends in the City of Vaughan involve homes with no working smoke alarms and many of these fires involve children. The Vaughan Fire and Rescue Service have expanded an existing program partnering with all the schools in the City of Vaughan to deliver the message of fire safety. With the help of the Maple Lions Club who donated 250 Sparky the Fire Dogs and the cooperation and partnerships of both the York Region Public and Catholic School Boards in the City of Vaughan this program has tremendous potential to make our community safer. This program involves all grade one students who will have an opportunity to take Sparky home along with a journal. In this journal, there is a fire safety check list and with their parents will complete the check list as Sparky cannot go to bed at night unless he knows the student and their families are safe from fire. They will then take or draw a picture of themselves and Sparky doing an activity and write a short story about their adventure with Sparky.

We were absolutely amazed with the response and the return of books during the trial of 4 schools with 10 participating classes involving grade one students in. All check lists were completed along with some amazing pictures and stories of the students and Sparky conducting fire safety activities. In 2016, 250 students took Sparky home and ensured their homes were fire safe. That relates to 250 households with a minimum of 3 persons per household and an untold number of family and friends that this could have extended through word of mouth that checked their homes for fire safety.

Program

Due to the success of the test program in 2016 we wanted to expand the program so more homes could be made fire safe. A request was made to the Fire Chief for an expansion of the program and permission to approach the Maple Lions Club for a donation of 250 Sparky Dogs as this is a considerable expense for our department. After receiving Chief Bentley's approval, we approached the Maple Lions Club and they were very willing to donate the Sparky Dogs. The Maple Lions Club are of the believe the best way to reach the parents is through the children. We have 73 Schools in the City of Vaughan which could translate into approximately 200 Grade one's classes and over 5,250 homes that would have their smoke alarms checked to ensure they are working, do fire drills with their families and have a meeting place outside. There are many other fire safety checks that must be completed by students and their parents in the check list in the journal.

We started by printing the journals in-house, the Maple Lions Club ordered the Sparky Dogs from The Fire Marshal's Safety Council and we organized our Fire Prevention Staff to deliver the program. We have 7 Inspectors and each Inspector received 7 to 10 schools that are in their areas, they had a binder with each school in a separate tab with pages to record the Principals, Vice Principals, and each grade one teacher their phone numbers, e-mail addresses and the number of students in each class to keep track of statistics. A flyer was made with instructions for the inspectors on our expectations and problems or questions they might encounter when approaching their schools. The expectation was each Inspector would approach their schools introduce themselves to the Principal and introduce the Sleepover with Sparky program. The Inspector had the option of leaving one Sleepover with Sparky Kit containing a letter for the Grade one teacher, one Sparky Dog and one journal in a Vaughan Fire and Rescue Bag for the Principal to show the Grade one teachers. We explained that this is not "yet another" program for the teachers to take on in that it is curriculum based and fits nicely into existing subjects that they are already teaching. As well, the Sleepover with Sparky the Fire Dog will help in meeting the demands of the current curriculum. It covers reading, writing, art, community helpers, health, public speaking, family involvement and safety. Most importantly, the program will reduce the student's chances of experiencing a fire and will also ensure the family has the early warning if a fire should occur by checking and addressing smoke alarm issues in the family's home including the new law requiring carbon monoxide alarms outside sleeping areas.

Vaughan Fire and Rescue decided to kick off the program the third week of September and chose one school to participate in the kick off. After approaching the school, we planned to go into a grade one class and present the program. Our partners were invited, the Maple Lions Club, representatives from the school boards were invited but could not attend and arrangements for our community Snap newspaper to attend. Fire Chief Bentley, Deputy Chief Rizzi, CFPO Lynch, and Fire Prevention Captain Clifton and Captain Best also attended along with Principal and Vice Principal and grade one teachers. The Sleepover with Sparky Program was well received by the students, they were very excited to have a turn taking Sparky home for a sleep over. Deputy Chief Rizzi tweeted out the kick off on social media and Snap (Local newspaper) published an article in their next addition as well as online. The school also added the Sleepover with Sparky on their web site and in their monthly bulletin.

Over the next few weeks all VFRS Inspectors approached their assigned schools and introduced the Sleepover with Sparky program. Most principals had to check with their grade one teachers but some were so excited about the program they just stated their teachers were going to do the program period. Some school were so impressed they made all the teachers take home the program to make their homes safe as well.

Once we had the school onboard arrangements were made to deliver the program to the grade one classes. Each inspector attended the school with enough Sparky bags for each grade one classes and explained the program to the grade on students. We made sure we explained that we check their schools, where they shop and where their parents work but we can't check their homes to see if they are fire safe. Therefore, it is so important that they go home and complete the fire safety checklist with their parents to ensure their homes are fire safe as most fires happen in homes, they could be saving their families lives.

In the 2017/2018 School year we had 54 out of 73 schools participating in the Sleepover with Sparky Program, which translates to 74%, 175 classes and 3,381 students who are took Sparky home to ensure their home are fire safe. By having the students take the Sleepover with Sparky home and work with their parents not only did they check their smoke alarms now but will be educated enough to make sure their families will stay safe in the future by knowing what to do and how important it is to ensure their families are fire safe and know what to do in case of a fire. Some of the points we also have on the check list involve kitchen safety, safe candle use, electrical safety, escape planning and having a meeting place outside the house. It also focuses on smoke alarms, their locations, there age and replacing their batteries. Carbon Monoxide detectors have been added to our check list when they became law. By ensuring that all these life safety devices and practices are in place that it will reduce the student's chances of experiencing a fire and will also ensure the family has the early warning if a fire should occur. We feel we can reach more homes this way then the traditional fire prevention week activities. We cannot even begin to measure how many more family and friends are impacted through word of mouth when the child and their parents tell others about their Sleepover with Sparky and ensuring their homes are also fire safe.

The objective of this program was to ensure every grade one student in the City of Vaughan took home Sparky for a Sleepover, out of 73 schools we had 54 with total commitment some even requesting we do the program with the grade 2 classes. With the limited amount of Sparky Dog's, we suggested that once the grade one's were finished we could supply them with new books and they could use the Sparky Dogs from the Grade one classes. We had several requests from private schools in Vaughan inquiring about the program and we explained to them about the limited amount of Sparky Dogs and we will defiantly include them next year. We had 3 schools that had closed, one school refused due to sanitary concerns and the other 15 schools had their agenda set for the year and would participate next year. Unfortunately, there has been several large fires with loss of life in the news which always we hope makes everyone pay attention to their fire safety at home. This is not always true and we hope by these children taking Sparky home and completing the check list we have made an impact on these families to be fire safe. Some of the journals have started coming back to us and the pictures and stories are great, not only are the parents checking all life safety devices, making and escape plan and meeting place but they are ensuring they have all fire safety devices they can. Some have bought fire extinguishers, additional smoke alarms and additional carbon monoxide detectors.

When Fire Prevention Inspectors started delivering the program they were very surprised on how well it was being received by the schools and how excited they were to participate in this program and how great the program was to address fire safety. Word of mouth spread throughout the school system and many schools were waiting for our arrival. We had a school board Trustee tweet about the program on Social Media with a picture of a student during his sleepover and his story. Our Fire Chief received several e-mails from students' parents on how great this initiative is and how excited their child was to take Sparky home to talk about fire safety. When the Inspectors started going into the classes to talk with the students they felt very rewarded and were very surprised at their interest. This program helped to build a relationship between the Inspectors and the Schools. We used this relationship to a positive and had the same Inspectors go back into the school to do a routine inspection. Many found when going back to the school they were greeted in a very friendly way, they knew the Principal and they went out of their way to ensure we had everything they needed. During their walk around many students who saw the Inspector waved and said hello and told them that they had their turn sleeping over with Sparky. This program not only has the potential of making over 3,300 homes fire safe it has built positive relationships with the York Region Public and Catholic Schools in Vaughan.

Tracking

All Inspectors have filled out their binders with the school's name, address, phone number, Principal and Vice Principals names and e-mail addresses along with the grade one teachers name, e-mails and number of students in the class. This gave us the number of classes participating and the number of students in each class. The inspector has told each teacher to contact them when each child has had their turn and they will return and have another fire safety talk with them congratulating them on their great work on their journal and possibly saving their families from a fire in their home. Some Inspectors have even booked a fire truck visit at the same time as a reward and more positive interactions with Vaughan Fire and Rescue. During these visits and the interaction with the fire fighters everyone always leaves with a smile on their faces especially the Fire Prevention Staff and the Fire Fighters.

Sleepover with Sparky Expansion Proposal

In 2016 we ran a test of the Sleepover with Sparky program we had 10 Sparky the Dog stuffed animals that went home with grade one students for a sleepover. Each Sparky bag consisting of a Sparky Dog, and a Journal that went to a grade one class with a total of 10 classes. Each class consisted of approximately 25 children; the teacher gave each child a turn to take Sparky home for a sleep over. Sparky could not sleep unless he knew he was safe so the child and her parents had to complete the checklist in the journal of things in the home to make it fire safe such as working smoke alarms and carbon monoxide alarms so Sparky could sleep. The child was to write about their adventure with Sparky and either draw a picture or take a picture and insert it into the journal with their storey. When the program was over we were extremely surprised and happy with the stories and pictures the students completed. With this program 250 students took Sparky home and made sure their homes were fire safe. That relates to 250 households with a minimum of 3 persons per household and an untold numbers of family and friends that this could have extended to through word of mouth that checked their homes for fire safety.

We are considering expanding the program this fall, the major expense is the Sparky Dogs at \$12.00 each and the fire prevention staff to assist in rolling it out. If we could reach every grade one class in The City of Vaughan, we could ensure 5,250 homes had been checked by grade one's and their parents for working smoke alarms and carbon monoxide alarms. There are 70 elementary schools in Vaughan with the majority of schools having 3 Grade 1 classes. With the class average about 25 this translates into 5,250 children who will be taking Sparky the Fire Dog home for a sleep over and making sure their homes are fire safe.

It was suggested to me that the Lion's Club is Celebrating 100 years of service and are looking for a community project to support. We could approach them and ask for a donation of 250 Sparky Dogs to expand this program. They could support the whole purchase of 250 Sparky Dogs at approximately \$3,000.00 or just a partial commitment.

I feel we can reach more homes this way then are traditional fire prevention week activities. We cannot even begin to measure how many more family and friends are impacted through word of mouth when the child and their parents tell others about their Sleepover with Sparky.

SLEEP OVER WITH SPARKY THE FIRE DOG

Instructions for Prevention Inspectors

This very an important fire safety initiative that can reach over 5,250 homes to ensure the children and parents are fire safe. The Vaughan Fire and Rescue Service Fire Prevention Division are trying to get all grade one classes and grade one/two split classes to participate in this program. The Sparky the fire dogs were generously donated by the Maple Lions Club as they also believe that the best way to reach the parents is through the children.

Please approach the Principals of all your assigned schools detailing the Sleepover with Sparky Program. Request the opportunity to speak to all of the grade one classes either all together or class by class once they agree to participate in the program. It is important to us to get as much information as possible please fill in the information sheet for each school.

Once you are given the approval make an appointment to deliver the program to the grade one/two classes. Take the teachers names, phone numbers and e-mails and give them your business cards so they may contact you if they have any questions or problems. Give each teacher a tote bag that contains one sparky stuffed dog, a scrapbook and a letter for the teacher with instructions. Inform the teacher if they have any problems like getting the kit back from a student or a damaged or lost dog to contact you.

It would be great if you could check up with the teacher either by dropping by the class or through e-mail every once and a while.

We would like to collect the Sleep over with Sparky kits at the beginning of May, if the teacher has completed before hand they can e-mail and you can collect it.



Sleep over with Sparky the Fire Dog

Dear Grade One Teacher:

Thank you for supporting Sleep over with Sparky Fire Safety Program. The program focuses on Grade One Classes. One of Fire Prevention Inspectors will visit the classroom and drop off a package to your classroom that will consist of;

- One Sparky Stuffed Toy
- One Scrapbook
- One Tote Bag
- 30 Fire Safety Checklists

Each child will have an opportunity to take Sparky home, complete the checklist with their family and record the experience on two pages of the scrapbook through pictures, drawings and writing. Some of the things we can do to support the program are classroom visits, truck and/or station tours, home escape plan contests, newsletter articles, etc.

Our Inspector will return in the late spring after each student has spent a couple of days with Sparky. During our spring visit, the Vaughan Fire and Rescue Fire Prevention Department will review the student's scrapbook, talk about fire prevention.

This is not "yet another" program for you to take on in that it is curriculum based and fits nicely into existing subjects that you are already teaching. As well, the Sleepover with Sparky the Fire Dog will actually help you in meeting the demands of the current curriculum. It covers reading, writing, art, community helpers, health, public speaking, family involvement and safety. Most importantly, the program will reduce the student's chances of experiencing a fire and will also ensure the family has the early warning if a fire should occur by checking and addressing smoke alarm issues in the family's home including the new law requiring carbon monoxide alarms outside sleeping areas.

50% of the fires we attend involve homes with no working smoke alarms and many of these fires involve children. The Vaughan Fire and Rescue Service have developed successful programs through the schools that deliver the message of fire safety to the home and encourage the families to take action. With your help this program has tremendous potential to make our community safer.
