### Preparing to Charge Service Providers and Reviewing Alternative Solutions - Then, Now and Alternative Solutions

#### **Nancy Macdonald-Duncan.**

Nancy has over twenty years' experience providing advice and assistance directly to the fire service and in fire service management. She has extensive knowledge and experience in strategic planning, risk assessment, capital and operating budgets, business case and report development as well as legislative compliance and enforcement.



Her career has spanned through roles as a prosecutor with the Regional Municipality of Niagara (one of the first licensed Paralegals in Ontario); Chief Fire Prevention Officer (St. Catharines Fire and Emergency Services), Division Chief overseeing Inspections and Enforcement; Deputy Chief overseeing the entire Fire Prevention Division; Acting Fire Chief during COVID (Mississauga Fire and Emergency Services); and, while working for the Office of the Fire Marshal in her roles as Program Specialist, Prosecutions, Manager Community Safety Enhancements; and, in her most recent role as Director/Deputy Fire Marshal – Fire Investigations.

Since retiring from the Fire Marshal's Office in July of 2025, Nancy has established her own Fire Safety Consulting company, "NMD Consulting Services" focusing on providing advice and assistance in fire safety compliance.

A historical look back at when the fire service did not enforce; the steps it took to move the fire service into the direction of enforcement (triggers such as lack of smoke alarm fatalities; marijuana grow operations); issues and road blocks within the municipality and/or legislation; where we are now (honest open discussion about where departments feel they are with respect to compliance and enforcement) and where do we go from here (more out of province/country owners for instance). What's working, What's not.



### Connecting NFPA 13 to the New Fire Code

#### **Mike Norris, Norris Fire Consulting Inc.**

Mr. Norris, Principal and founder of Norris Fire Consulting Inc has a Bachelor of Science in Fire Protection and Life Safety Engineering Technology from the University of Cincinnati graduating with college honors and has a Diploma in Fire Protection Engineering Technology from Seneca College in Toronto, Ontario.



Mr. Norris also has a Limited Engineering License from Professional Engineer's Ontario (PEO) and is also a Professional Licensee (Engineering) in British Columbia and Engineering Licensee in Manitoba and Saskatchewan with a scope limitation for fire protection and fire alarm systems.

Mr. Norris's project experience includes the design and review of life safety and fire protection systems including automatic sprinkler protection, suppression systems, underground water supply analysis, fire alarm initiation and notification, egress analysis, access control, fire resistance ratings, smoke control, due diligence surveys and alternative construction methods & compliance, alternative egress studies utilizing computational egress models. Mike will be speaking on notable changes to the 2019 edition NFPA 13 with the goal to focus on the items relevant to fire inspector. He also will be discussing the requirements for sprinkler systems in Part 3 of the new Ontario Fire Code, specifically aerosol storage, hazardous materials, unprotected vs protected storage options.

Throughout his career, Raymond has managed and supervised fire alarm operations for leading companies, specializing in installation, inspection, verification, troubleshooting, and compliance.

Steven Lott is Vice President of the Canadian Fire Alarm Association's Central Ontario Chapter and a seasoned fire alarm professional with over 20 years of field experience. As Head of Training and Education at EPI Fire Protection, Steven has established himself as an industry leader whose methodical troubleshooting methods have taught fire alarm technicians across Canada. Ray and Steve will be describing the newly implemented changes made to the CAN/ULC-S536-2019, "Standard for Inspection and Testing of Fire Alarm Systems". They will be testing a fire alarm system showing the new requirements along with results of the test. Also, will be testing other components of the fire alarm system with the tools required to show the participants what it takes to test a fire alarm system.

### Susy Ceolin, Communications Program Manager.



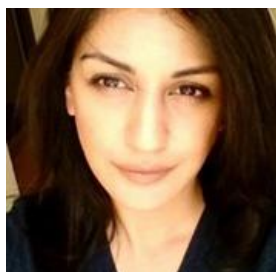

Attendees will gain insight into current large-scale campaigns, upcoming training opportunities, and modern strategies for digital and community engagement.



## Changing Fire Alarm and Fire Protection Systems in Existing Buildings - The Like For Like Lie

**Paul Latreille - Jensen Hughes.**



Paul has 40 years experience in the fire protection and life safety consulting engineering business. Paul has developed an expertise in fire alarm and voice communication systems design, electronic locking and electromagnetic lock design, and many specialty fire protection systems designs. Paul has been a member of the NBCC subcommittee on fire alarm design and actively participates in many industry associations. Paul has worked on many high profile projects in his career including The Peace Tower and Centre Block, Pearson Terminal 1, The Toronto Eaton Centre, The Canadian Tire Centre and many other projects across the country.

This presentation will explore the complexities of replacing or upgrading fire alarm systems and other fire protection systems in existing buildings, specifically addressing the widespread misconception of the "like-for-like" replacement approach that many fire alarm and fire protection companies use hoping to avoid the need for engineers or permits when replacing fire alarm and other life safety systems. This practice can undermine safety and compliance. The session will not only delve into the relevant codes and regulations but will also highlight real-world examples from various projects that clearly demonstrate why the "like-for-like" method is problematic.

Drawing on over 40 years of industry experience, Paul will offer expert insights and share lessons learned from his role as an expert witness, Fire Code application and when building permits are required for work being requested by the Fire Department and will shed light on the critical importance of compliance when dealing with life safety systems.



### Administrative Monetary Penalty System – AMPS

#### **Brenda Russell.**

Brenda was employed with the City of Barrie for 32 years, retiring in 2013 from the position of Manager of Municipal Law and Prosecution Services. In her position with the City of Barrie, she was responsible for an enforcement team of more than 25 officers, as well as a prosecutorial team responsible for the prosecution of all Provincial Offences within the County of Simcoe.

She was responsible for the POA transfer project in the City of Barrie, one of the first 7 demonstration sites in Ontario in 1999. This project transitioned all Provincial Offences services from the Provincial level to the Municipal level including POA prosecutions and court services for all municipalities, First Nations and the federal base within the County boundaries.

Outside of the City of Barrie, she was a part-time faculty member with Georgian College Orillia campus for 7 years instructing Municipal Law Enforcement.

Brenda is a life member of the Municipal Law Enforcement Officers' Association serving on the board of directors for 38 of her 40 membership years, including 15 years as President. She also led the Education team for the Association for over 20 years developing various training courses and workshops. She continues to serve as a course Facilitator and Instructor for the Association and has trained thousands of officers across the province over the years.

She was responsible for the development of the Residential Housing training program delivered jointly by the Ministry of Housing and the Municipal Law Enforcement Officers' Association across the Province and has also had the honour of developing and delivering training for the Atlantic By-law Enforcement Officers, an Association encompassing officers from all of the maritime provinces, including Newfoundland and Labrador.

She has served on numerous professional and community Boards of Directors over the years and currently resides in Muskoka where she enjoys her gardens, grandchildren, and cat Loki in her spare time.

### Arson Offenders and Criminal Investigative Analysis: Geographic Profiling and Arson Offender Research

**Bill Gofton, Retired, Ontario Provincial Police.**



Bill Gofton is a retired member of the Ontario Provincial Police with extensive experience in major crime investigations, drug enforcement, and criminal behaviour analysis. He spent the latter half of his career with the Criminal Behaviour Analysis Section (CBAS), where he served as the Operational Manager of the Threat and Behaviour Analysis Team.

During his tenure with CBAS, Mr. Gofton received specialized training from leading experts and investigative agencies, including the FBI. He is a certified Geographic Criminal Profiler and a certified Threat Assessment Investigator. In these capacities, he contributed to investigations involving serial offenders—such as serial sexual offenders, arsonists, and homicide perpetrators—as well as cases involving threats of violence, including school shooting threats, bombings, and arson. He is a court-qualified expert and a recognized subject matter expert in violence risk assessment.

Mr. Gofton holds a Bachelor of Arts in Law with a concentration in Criminology from Carleton University and is an active member of the Canadian Association of Threat Assessment Professionals. In 2018, he was named OPP Officer of the Year for his assistance to victims of the Las Vegas mass shooting. He currently serves as a civilian consultant / forensic analyst under contract with the OPP's CBAS Research Unit.
